




ACCOMPLISHMENTS ALONG THE CORRIDOR

ALLEGHENY RIVER TRAIL

- Completed the Richey Run Bridge Rehab located at the southern boundary of Venango County on the corridor being developed into the trail.

OIL CREEK STATE PARK TRAIL

- Continued engineering for the first mile of the trail from Petroleum Center South; the project is expected to be bid for construction spring of 2025.
- Continued engineering for a bridge for the trail to cross Oil Creek, and seeking funding for it's construction.

EAST BRANCH TRAIL

- Constructed .4 miles of trail with volunteer equity connecting the trail from Rosenberg Road to Greytown Road where it joins the completed segment of trail and trailhead in the Crawford County Forest.
- Constructed 1 mile of trail form sportman Bridge south funded through the Applicachian Regional Commission.
- Completed design and began the rehabilitation of the Sportsman Bridge funded by the PA DCNR .

QUEEN CITY TRAIL

- Over 150 people participated in the *Find Your Adventure* event held on the trail in conjunction with National Trails Day.

CORRY TRAIL JUNCTION TRAIL

- Created the "Friends of Corry Junction to help further trail development in the Corry Area.
- Installed additional amenities along trails.
- Installed additional amenities along the trail.

CHAUTAUQUA RAIL TRAIL

- Resurfacing section of trail between Highland Ave and Webster Road in Brocton, NY
- Development of a new strategic plan
- Hosted a the first ever Chautauqua County Trails Day event.
- Established a trail stewardship program to help with trail maintenance.

ALLEGHENY RIVER TRAIL ON CLARION COUNTY

- Completed design of the park master plan for a small park /trailhead in Foxburg.
- Constructed 1800 feet of trail with volunteer equity coneting to the recently rehabilitated Ritchey Run Bridge
- Continued efforts to acquire easements of the remaining 2.2 miles of landowners up to Emlenton.

ARMSTRONG TRAILS

- Brady Tunnel rrehabilitation completed and opened.
- Constructed an additonal 10 miles of trail on the Erie to Pittsburgh Trail corridor.

ERIE COUNTY TRAILS

- Constructed a trailhead along the an alternative trail route in Union City
- Began negotiation with the railroad owner to develop rail with trail.

THREE RIVERS HERITAGE TRAIL

- Continued working with multiplr municipalities and other partners to acquire , design, and secured fundstoward development of trail.

ERIE TO PITTSBURGH TRAIL ASSOCIATION

- Secured funding to contract with a consultant to continue work with communites and organizations to close gaps on the EPT corridor, and purchase trail counters.
- Co-hosted the forst Western PA Greenways and Trails Summit attended by approximately 150 people.
- Developed new trailmap/ guide.
- Partnered with several regional organizations to prepare a proposal to be submitted to PA DOT for planning on the EPT.
